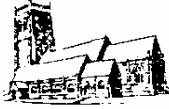

## EXTENDING NURSERY PROVISION

We have the opportunity of extending the provision for nursery provision over and above the 5 sessions paid by voucher. However, any additional sessions would have to be paid for by parents and would NOT come under the free voucher scheme.

However, the good news is that Torbay Early Years team have been given the go ahead to let us increase the hours available with the voucher from 12  $\frac{1}{2}$  hours to 15 hours a week. This is a trial in part of Torbay - and we are included!

We need to know what the level of interest is for this proposed increased in provision over and above the new increase to 15 hours.

We will also be able to offer a school lunch from September 2009, as a result of the changes to the catering contract. This would also be an extra charge - and include lunchtime staff and the meal costs.

We are also considering longer day care provision. We would like to offer provision from 7.45 am and for the first slot, make our Breakfast Club available to nursery aged children. This has been working successfully in other schools and we want to follow the good practice already in the Bay.

There is also the opportunity to extend the provision from 3.15 pm. This needs a bit more organisation as it would involve a new facility - an After School Club. We would, of course, try to keep costs as low as possible.

What we want to know at the moment is the level of interest so that we can see if this is viable. Therefore, I'd be very grateful if you would complete the attached questionnaire and return it to either the Nursery or School Office.

We are not suggesting that every child should stay at Nursery from early morning to late at night for five days a week! What we are trying to do is to see if we can fit in with working families' needs and commitments.
